Preferred Options Consultation 2025

Cotswold District Council is updating its Local Plan following ambitious new housing targets set by the government. For Cotswold District, this means the number of homes the Council needs to plan for each year has



more than doubled to 1,036 as part of the national drive to build 1.5 million homes during this parliament. This is a significant challenge in a district where over 80% of land is designated as a National Landscape and infrastructure is already under pressure.

What's changed this year? – Cotswold District Council no longer has a 5-year housing land supply. This makes it much more challenging to refuse planning applications for housing.

In light of this, the Council is running a consultation from 14 November 2025 until 2 January 2026 on the different options to deliver this target. The consultation asks for views on where up to 18,650 more homes could be built across the district between now and 2043. There are currently 6,150 homes already in the pipeline that can contribute, so that means finding sites for 12,500 additional homes. These are high level proposals and they are looking for feedback on where development should go and what facilities, services and infrastructure would be needed to support this.

Additionally, the consultation looks beyond 2043, offering a longer-term view of future development for locations that could accommodate more new homes.

Representatives from Kempsford Parish Council attended a recent briefing on the Cotswold District Council's 'Preferred Option' for where the additional new homes could be built between now and 2043. This 'preferred option' would deliver 14,660 homes, only 79% of the Government's target.


The numbers for our area are shocking. These include:

The above figures do not take account of the 'windfall' requirements for some 780 additional homes to be built in other rural settlements and open countryside within the district



Points to note:

- Figures are indicative.
- No site allocations being made at this stage.
- Sites remain subject to consultation, evidence gathering, and infrastructure feasibility.
- Some sites may not progress to the next stage of the Local Plan update (Regulation 19) if found unsuitable, unachievable or unavailable.

What do these proposals mean to our community?

- Although Kempsford Parish is not specifically mentioned, it does not mean that sites will not come forward as part of the 'windfall' requirement. Many may recall that there have been two applications refused on the land between The Knoll and John of Gaunt. Should an application come forward again, we have less protection now and might instead need to try and shape it.
- Many of us use the facilities at Fairford and Lechlade, and have first hand experience of the pressures both towns are currently under, without more houses!
- Without the appropriate investment in infrastructure, services and amenities, what will the impact be on Schools, Doctor's surgeries, shops, sewerage and traffic, to name a few!
- The nature of our surrounding area will fundamentally change forever.

What can we do?

- Cotswold District Council is keen to hear from all residents. The sharing of local knowledge is invaluable as part of the 'evidence gathering and infrastructure feasibility' stage.
